Searching for an easy idea to celebrate the Woman's Suffrage movement? Why not work with your local library, or college campus library, and put together a display featuring books and DVDs available for check-out?



Whether you have a member who is a former librarian or not, this idea is quite simple to do. Most libraries have a searchable data base, today's equivalent of the card catalog. You may wish to consider working with a librarian. Develop a list of fiction and non-fiction books for adults, young-adults, and juvenile readers. Find a display area at your library. Grab a few members and spend a few hours pulling books and filling display cases with books, DVDs, posters, and other items depicting the suffrage movement.

AAUW Flagler unveiled this display on Monday, August 26, 2019, at the end of their skit, "Women WON the Vote: How Did THAT

Happen", performed the same day at the library. You don't have to do the skit. The display is very easy and costs little. Many have suffrage display items used for past events.

You could also take this same idea and use it for March, Women's History month. That way, you could broaden the array of books and topics.
