Human Trafficking and Proposed Florida Legislation 2021

Human Trafficking

- Human trafficking is modern-day slavery and involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act.
- **Human trafficking** victims are children and adults, both male and female.
- It is estimated that worldwide more than **40 million people are victims of human trafficking**, and domestically, 800,000 of which **80 percent are women and children** (*United Nations*).
- It is estimated that **human trafficking generates \$150 billion dollars of profit per year**, second only to drug trafficking as the most profitable form of transnational crime (*International Labor Organization*),

Human Trafficking in Florida

- Florida has taken some great first steps, enacting the National Trafficking Hotline Posting Laws, Safe Harbor Laws and Vacatur Laws.
- More is needed to combat Trafficking. Florida ranks 3rd in U.S. human trafficking cases reported by states (National Human Trafficking Center).
- Orlando ranked 3rd, Miami 4th, Tampa 8th, Jacksonville 48th out of the top 100 most populous cities from 2007 to 2016, according to the most recent reports from the National Human Trafficking Center.
- **Victims Need** emergency housing, legal assistance, specialized healthcare, counseling, immigration relief, job training, education and long-term housing.

SUPPORT: Human Trafficking Education in Schools (SB 554/HB 1303)

• **Increased confidentiality** between victim and advocate in certain circumstances. Pathway to possible increased time to prepare for court. Expunction of driving records.
